- Safe, Accountable, flexible, efficient, transportation Equity Act: A legacy for users (SAFETEA-LU)
- Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21)
- Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST)
- California developed its first SHSP in 2005 to focus on reducing traffic fatalities and serious injuries on <u>all public roads</u>
- Currently, we are on the third update 2020-2024

What is the SHSP?

- Statewide, coordinated traffic safety plan
- Provides the framework to reduce fatalities and serious injuries on all California public roads
- Strategic, data-driven process
- Follows federal guidance
- Consists of three groups
 - Executive Leadership
 - Steering Committee
 - Challenge Area Teams





Accomplishments and Improvements from the 2015–2019 SHSP

Accomplishments from 2015–2019 SHSP

From the 2015–2019 SHSP, 110 implementation action items were accomplished by December 31, 2019.

Highlights include:

Increased the number of CHP personnel who have completed **Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE)** training to **96%**

Launched **"Alive at 25"** campaign aimed **at teen-specific driver diversion programs**



Systemic Safety Analysis Report Program was developed with **over**

100 safety plans



Trucker Appreciation Activities

- Hosted six trucker appreciation events with 1,500 drivers attending
- Held two trucker appreciation days in 2018 and nine in 2016





Accomplishments from 2015–2019 SHSP



In 2018, CHP conducted **enhanced enforcement operations focused on pedestrian safety**, including pedestrian safety enforcement operations, school zone enforcement operations, and vehicles illegally passing school zones operations, **resulting in 2,946 citations** to motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians

Held over **1,000 pedestrian outreach** and **education traffic safety events** reaching **over 300,000 people**

California held **over 20 train-the-trainer sessions** to expand the Traffic Incident Management (TIM) training program



Implemented an HSIP program that incorporated High Friction Surface Treatment (HFST) incentives and prioritized low-cost safety methodologies


- **3 HFST projects** funded in Cycle 9 HSIP call for projects
- 107 low-cost safety measures funded in Cycle 9 HSIP call for projects


Total Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions by Year

Statewide Collision Data


Total Fatalities by Year

Emerging Technologies: Apply emerging technologies


Enforcement: Enforce actions to reduce high-risk behaviors

Safe System Principles

- Institutionalize equity by formally integrating into <u>all</u> aspects of the SHSP
- Develop a working definition of equity in the context of the SHSP
